Welcome to the Earth-Age Display

A journey through 4,600 million years of geological history

This is the starting-point of the Earth Age display.
Walk along this path for the next 46 metres and read the storyboards in sequence. It highlights the birth of the planet and how the Earth's incredibly long geological history formed over a period of 4,600 Ma (million years) until the present day.

Geology is the science of the Earth. The rocks and minerals which make it up, and the different processes which formed these rocks and minerals, and then changed them over this lengthy period of geological time.

Important geological events and milestones, describing interesting facts that occurred during certain time periods, including the presence of early living organisms, life forms and extinctions are highlighted.

Rock Display
At the end of the display you will be directed to a central Rock Garden which will show you in more detail the various types of rocks found in this area. The age of these rocks range from about 600 Million.

It all started from a disc of dust

Separated into different layers
Initially it was all molten, but eventually cooled and separated out into the molten, heavy, iron core, the surrounding mantle, and, at last, the crust on which we live.
