Volunteer Training- held at the Nest on the 21-22 August

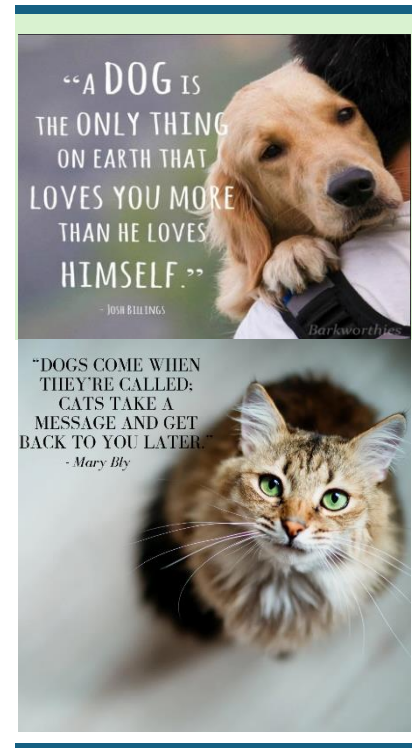
Seven of our volunteers attended the training session for Animal Welfare Assistants. The Expert was Sister Hilda Mills from Ebervets.

The course was a comprehensive two-day event that combined both theoretical and practical learning.

The first day focused on classroom theory, where participants learned about the inspection and diagnosis of common conditions in dogs and cats, as well as treatments and medications.

The second day allowed for hands-on experience in the field, reinforcing the theoretical knowledge with practical skills.

This was followed by discussions on policy recommendations for sterilization and legal aspects of animal welfare, emphasizing the importance of collaboration with law enforcement in outreach situations. SAWS plans to hold this course annually.
